

Sodding Bid Sheet

Scope

- A. Refer to site specific plan provided by Green Country Habitat for Humanity (GCHFH) for general and supplementary site conditions.
- B. Contractor to provide all labor, operations, materials, and equipment necessary to complete this work.

Quality Assurance: Transplanted sod shall be uniform in color, leaf, texture and shoot density and be reasonably free of visible imperfections at acceptance.

Product - Lawn Sod: Bermuda sod or one of the local approved strains as approved by GCHFH representative.

Preparation

- A. Examine finished surfaces, grades, topsoil quality and depth. Do not start sodding work until unsatisfactory conditions are corrected.
- B. Loosen topsoil of lawn areas to be sodded. Remove stones, sticks, roots, rubbish, and extraneous matter.
- C. Grade lawn areas to a smooth, free draining and even surface with loose, uniformly fine texture. Roll and rake to remove ridges and fill depressions as required to drain.

Installation

- Lay sod to form a solid mass with tightly fitted joints. Butt ends and sides of sod strips. Do not overlay edges. Stagger strips to offset joints in adjacent courses.
- Install sod top flush with adjacent curbs, sidewalks, drives, drains, meter cans, and abutted lawns, etc.
- Place sod strips parallel to dominant contour.
- Do not install sod on saturated or frozen soil.
- Water sod lightly immediately after laying.
- Roll with water filled, commercial lawn roller to insure contact with subgrade. Immediately after rolling, the sod shall be watered thoroughly.

Clean-Up - Perform cleaning upon completion of work. Remove from site all excess materials, debris, and equipment. Repair damage caused by sodding operations.
